



## Annual Programme Monitoring Review

## Report of APMR for Academic Year 2018 - 2019

I am very pleased to report another successful APMR cycle.

Satisfactory returns were received from 16 universities, including direct entry courses. The UK has some excellent, accredited programmes and programme teams. There continues to be an increase in numbers of students enrolled, and also a small increase in the numbers obtaining awards when compared with 2017 to 18 as seen in the table below.

Numbers overall are still lower than at the peak in 2015-16, but there are still a good number of students. It will be interesting to see how numbers compare going forwards. There is still a good range of modules and the students continue to come from a variety of backgrounds. We note difficulties of increasing workload and clinical pressures, which has an effect on clinical placements for students and can affect the retention of students on programmes.
