2) Medium Term Outcomes of Deep Venous Stenting in the Management of Venous Thoracic Outlet Syndrome

A look at the patency rates of venous stents in the management of venous TOS

**EVALUATION + ANALYSIS**

Very small scale, single centered study. Reported patency rates look promising but difficult to generalise these results based only on 33 stents (26 patients).

**CONCLUSION**

Interesting and informative article but a larger study is needed to generalise.

**ACTION PLAN**

Continue to perform upper limb DVT scans as per departmental protocol. I have only come across 1 true venous TOS in 10 years, therefore it is very uncommon in our vascular department. It is a condition to be aware of however.
