Personal Reflection:

The diagnosis of iliac endofibrosis in the vascular lab remains challenging because this condition is rare and visualisation of affected vessels may be limited by bowel gas or position. New parameters may help with the diagnosis; however this study was conducted in one centre only. I'm currently working on a review article on the same subject and will certainly include this new index. (Please note the correct multiple choice for question c does not seem to be available - According to text, the first post op follow up was at 3 to 6 month and the second follow after 1 year. Please correct me If I'm wrong in my interpretation).

Diagnosis of Pop entrapment is also challenging, and although I was already under the impression ultrasound alone was not accurate, this was the first study I read that confirmed my suspicion. Other imaging modalities will always be needed; Although there was some mentioned to the muscles involved, the different types of entrapment were not describes.
