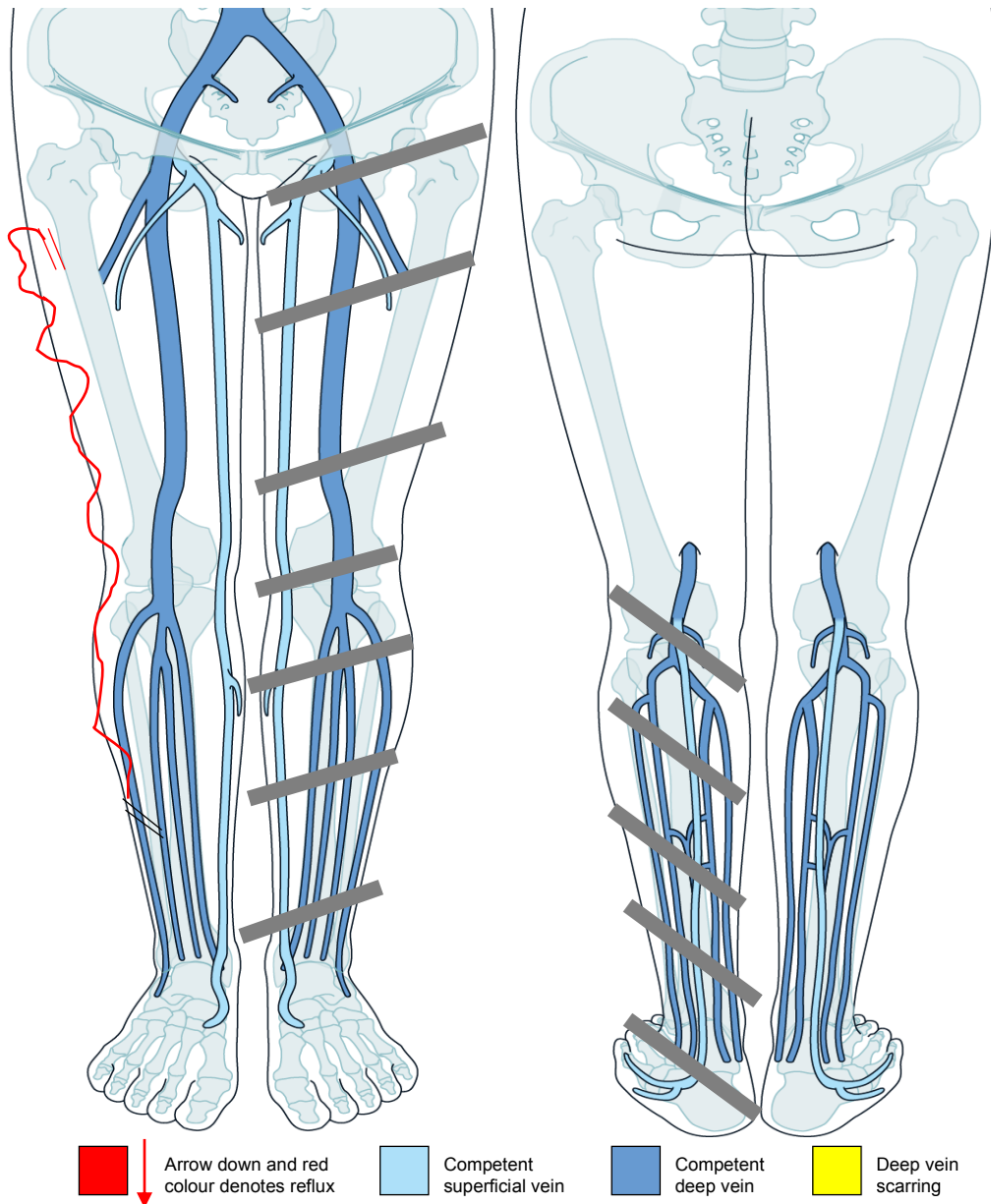
Clinical Indications:

?right leg calf claudication. Varicose veins in right calf,
venous incompetence

Lower Limb -RIGHT LEG Venous Insufficiency scan

Anterior view

Posterior view



Report:

RIGHT LEG VEINS:

SFJ, GSV and SSV are patent and competent (no SPJ identified).

All deep veins are patent and competent. No scarring to note.

Lateral hip perforator 15cm below the hip is communicating with a 2mm diameter VV (0.1mm from the skin surface) which courses down the lateral thigh and onto the calf to communicate with a distal lateral calf perforator (d=1mm).

Conclusion:

No main truncal incompetence.

Incompetent lateral proximal thigh perforator is refluxing into the associated VV which courses down the leg.
