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**Report:**

SFJ, GSV and SSV are patent and competent. SPJ could not be visualised.

There is a small 1.8mm superficial incompetent vein (1.3mm from skin surface) tracking from the lateral mid-thigh ? incompetent perforator (unable to trace origin due to small vein diameter). This VV courses down the lateral thigh and onto the lateral calf where it exits reflux through a competent antero/lateral perforator.

All deep veins are patent and competent.

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**Conclusion:**

No main truncal insufficiency.

? incompetent lateral thigh varicose perforator (too small to trace)
